The average
American is
estimated to throw
away around 37kg
of clothes every
year



By 2030, we are expected to throw away more than 134 million tonnes of textiles a year

90% of our clothes come from Asia

Just 12% of the material used for clothing ends up being recycled

92 million tonnes are thrown away every year

textile production releases 1.2 billion tonnes of greenhouse gases every year

100 billion garments are produced each year

the fashion industry is responsible for 10% of all greenhouse gas emissions
